

Dear Music Friends

I must cast aside all modesty and think aloud: With over 60 extraordinary musicians performing in 22 concerts, the 2025 festival promises once again to be a true feast of chamber music, set against the stunning backdrop of Hindsgavl Castle near Middelfart.

Naturally, you do not need to stay all eight days but you are of course welcome to pick individual days or single concerts.

As always, we delve deeply into the many corners of chamber music.

During the festival's first five days, wind instruments will take up a slightly larger portion of the program than usual, culminating in a performance by the young wind quintet BREEZE, who will present delightful French works with piano.

The festival always features 3–4 concerts showcasing music performed on **period**

instruments, often focusing on "early music," including Baroque compositions. In this category, we present the ensemble Arcangelo, led by Jonathan Cohen, with an all-Händel program and delightful vocal soloists—more details below (July 7).

Over the past 10–15 years, the focus within period instruments has shifted forward in time. This trend has been reflected in the Hindsgavl Festival's program, where we have, on several occasions, featured early 19th-century fortepianos that have brought Mozart, Beethoven, and Schubert to life in truly astonishing ways.

At the 2025 festival, we shift the historical focus all the way to the late Romantic era. During the festival's final three days, you can experience a daily concert featuring an 1859 Blüthner grand piano—perfect for works by Brahms and his contemporaries. Three different pianists will explore the instrument, with **Olga Paschenko** (July 7) and **Ronald Brautigam** (July 9) standing out as true specialists in fortepiano interpretations. It promises to be both fascinating and exceptional!

We generally avoid programming the same piece twice in the same year, but we're making an exception with Brahms' Piano Quintet. This gives the audience the chance to hear the work performed on historical instruments (July 8) and on modern instruments, featuring steel strings and a 2022 Steinway concert grand (July 2).

The first performance of Brahms' Piano Quintet will feature the outstanding German musicians Martin Helmchen and Marie-Elisabeth Hecker, among others (July 2). The couple launched the Fliessen Music Festival in 2024, hosted on their charming farm 100 km south of Berlin. With Fliessen taking place close to the Hindsgavl Festival on the calendar, a collaboration between the two festivals was a natural fit. This year, a small team from Fliessen will visit the Hindsgavl Festival and perform two concerts (July 2 and July 3).

For a piano enthusiast like me, the solo piano recitals —three of which are on this year's program—are especially exciting. I've already mentioned Olga Paschenko and the Blüthner grand (July 7), but the Steinway concert grand will also face a demanding schedule, particularly from July 3 at 20:00 to July 4 at 13:00. During this time, it will be both pampered and rigorously tested with a total of four hours of solo piano music:

In the evening of July 3, Franz Liszt is on the menu, served by **Denis Kozhukhin**. Then, on the morning of 4 July, we can hear something as rare as Messiaen's entire mastodontic 2½-hour work with *Twenty Contemplations on the Infant Jesus*. Don't miss pianist **Kristoffer Hyldig**'s introduction to the work the morning before, on 3 July at 10:30.

All in all, the festival boasts a total of 10 outstanding pianists - three of them playing solo. Well, we couldn't do it with fewer, as each and every one of the 10 has their own specialty or is part of a unique collaboration.

One of these specialists is **Malcolm Martineau**, who is something of an institution in accompanying **singers**. He performs in 2025 with two exciting younger singers: Soprano Patricia Nolz, already well established on the big opera stages (8 July) and Theodore Platt, a more than promising baritone living in Copenhagen.

Speaking of singers! Countertenor **lestyn Davies** with soprano Soroya Mafi are soloists with the Arcangelo ensemble in a stunning Handel programme (7 July). Soprano **Christiane Karg** sings a unique lied programme involving flutes and cello (5 July).

And then there are all the strings, 21 in total of whom cellist **Christian Poltéra** will appear in three concerts, including with the **Chiaroscuro Quartet** in the Schubert String Quintet (8 July) - naturally on gut strings, as in Schubert's time.

We've hosted the Chiaroscuro Quartet twice before, in 2012 and 2016, and we have them on our top 5 list of best string quartets in the world.

From the stage, radio host **Mathias Hammer** will briefly introduce the concerts. Mathias has been associated with the festival since 2014, and in recent years he has become a very well-known face and voice in Danish public radio/TV.

On the 6 middle days of the festival at 10:00, Mathias Hammer will also host a talk in English with an artist from yesterday's program.

Other regular non-music ingredients at the festival contribute to the wonderful atmosphere: the small tent camp for young people, the picturesque setting, and - most importantly: an engaging and curious audience from Denmark and abroad.

Hope you enjoy the programme and look forward to seeing you all next summer.



Tickets with accommodation

This category of ticket includes accommodation in the 120-room castle (manor house), from where everything is within walking distance: Concerts, meals, rooms, bar, etc.

What is included?

The festival stay starts with room check-in from 14:00 on the date of arrival and ends on departure day with check-out at 10:00 or before.

In that time span the following is included: Evening buffet at 18:00, accommodation, breakfast buffet and admission to all concerts, including a glass of wine or similar during the interval of the evening concert.

Room upgrades

Upon availability, it is possible to request room upgrades. An extra fee will be charged directly by the Hotel which is due to be paid upon check-out.

The most common upgrades:

- Room in "the Stables": EUR 41,-/day
- Junior Suite: From EUR 68,-/day
- Room suitable for wheelchair: EUR 41,-/day
- With dog in room ("stables"): EUR 81,- for the first day, then EUR 68,-/day.

Getting there

The 18th century Hindsgavl Castle is located 3 km from the picturesque city of Middelfart and only 200 meters from the sea. Once you have reached the castle, everything is in walking distance: Rooms, concert venues, dining, rooms, etc.

Distances by car/bicycle

German border: 100 km; Copenhagen: 215 km; Hamburg: 265 km; Berlin: 540 km; Paris: 1.150 km.

By train from Germany

Good connections from Germany. You should aim for Middelfart Station (via Kolding or Fredericia). From there, a five minute drive (taxi: 12-13 Euro) takes you to Hindsgavl. Travel time from Hamburg is about 3 hours 30 minutes.

By airplane

Closest airport is **Billund Airport**, 65 km from Hindsgavl. Taxi costs around 150 Euro, one-way. Bus/train is possible but complicated.

Alternative airport is **Copenhagen Airport (Kastrup)**: There are direct train connections between this airport and the town of Middelfart. These trains depart on an hourly basis with a commuting time of approx. 2h 20 min.
